Wayne County Board of Supervisors

A regular meeting of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors was held on the 4th day of March 2025, at the Wayne County Courthouse in the Lower-Level Conference Room, Corydon, lowa, pursuant to notice duly given in compliance with the lowa Code Section 21.4. The Board noted due notice of meeting subject to said Code Section.

Present- Chris Moore, Todd Wilson, and Lance Lange members of the Board. Also in attendance: Dillon Davenport, Dan Carpenter, Don Seams, Savanah Sandy, and Michelle Dooley.

The Corydon Times Republican live streams the Board of Supervisors regular session meetings on their Facebook page. Unless otherwise noted, all motions are approved unanimously by all Board members present.

Moore called the meeting to order at 10:00AM and took roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance

Wilson made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Moore.

Lange made a motion to approve February 18, 2025, Regular Meeting Minutes, seconded by Wilson.

Wilson made a motion to approve February 25, 2025, Special Meeting Minutes, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve February 28, 2025, payroll, seconded by Wilson.

Wilson made a motion to approve March 4, 2025, claim set, seconded by Lange.

No public comments on agenda items.

Engineer Dillon Davenport reported that concrete crushing on Liberty Road (east) is complete, and contract is cleaning up. Road rock will be applied before, the road will be reopened for traffic.

Tree grinders are working south of Seymour and north of Corydon.

Bridge crew should pour concrete patches on Jubilee Bridge soon.

Lange made a motion to approve the final plans for project number FM-C093(103)—55-93, seconded by Wilson. Wilson made a motion to reject all bids received for contract number 93-C093-103, seconded by Lange.

Moore read the Title VI Policy Statement for Wayne County, Iowa.

The County of Wayne assures that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, or sex as provided by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 (P.L. 100.259), be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity. The County of Wayne further assures every effort will be made to ensure nondiscrimination in all of its committees, programs and activities, regardless of the funding source.

The County of Wayne will include Title VI language in all written agreements and bid notices and will monitor compliance.

The Coordinator of the County of Wayne Will be responsible for initiating and monitoring Title VI activities, and all other responsibilities required.

Dan Carpenter is the Title VI Coordinator/Wayne County Assistant to the Engineer.

Wilson made a motion to approve and adopt this policy statement, seconded by Lange.

Moore introduced Resolution 25-19 which reads the following:

Resolution consenting to financing plan for Wayne-Ringgold-Decatur County Solid Waste Management Commission

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of Wayne County, Iowa (the "County") has authorized and executed a certain Intergovernmental Agreement Creating the Wayne-Ringgold-Decatur County Solid Waste Management Commission (the "28E Agreement") pursuant to Chapter 28E of the Code of Iowa, and the members of the 28E Agreement (including the County) are Wayne County, Ringgold County, Decatur County, and the Cities of Lamoni, Leon, Davis City,

Garden Grove, Van Wert, Decatur City, Grand River, Weldon, Pleasanton, LeRoy, Mount Ayr, Diagonal, Kellerton, Tingley, Redding, Ellston, Maloy, Beaconsfield, Benton, Humeston, Allerton, Lineville, and Clio (collectively, the "Members"); and

WHEREAS, the terms of the 28E Agreement provide for the creation of the Wayne-Ringgold-Decatur County Solid Waste Management Commission (the "Commission") for the purposes of providing for the economic transport, processing, and disposal of all solid waste produced within the jurisdictional area of the Members of the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has authority pursuant to the 28E Agreement and Chapter 28F of the Code of lowa to issue revenue bonds and interim financing notes to pay the costs of projects undertaken by the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has proposed to undertake the acquisition of equipment and the construction of improvements for the disposal of solid waste, including the Commission's landfill improvements (the "Projects"); and

WHEREAS, a financing plan (the "Financing Plan") has been prepared and submitted to the Commission for review for the funding of the Projects; and

WHEREAS, the Financing Plan includes: (1) the issuance by Ringgold County of its General Obligation Landfill Bonds (the "General Obligation Bonds") in a principal amount not to exceed \$2,200,000; and (2) the execution of a revenue disbursement agreement (the "Revenue Agreement") between the Commission and Ringgold County covering revenue payments by the Commission to Ringgold County in an amount equal to the principal and interest to be paid on the General Obligation Bonds, plus reasonable administrative fees and expenses to compensate Ringgold County for its issuance and maintenance of those Bonds, and the execution and delivery of other related documents; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary for the Board to take action to approve the Financing Plan, the issuance of the General Obligation Bonds and the execution of the Revenue Agreement and other related documents;

NOW, THEREFORE, It is Hereby Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Wayne County, Iowa, as follows:

Section 1. The County hereby approves the undertaking of the Projects and the Financing Plan.

Section 2. Ringgold County's issuance of the General Obligation Bonds, as described in the Financing Plan and the preamble hereof, is hereby acknowledged and approved.

Section 3. The execution by the Commission of the Revenue Agreement, as described in the Financing Plan and the preamble hereof, is hereby approved pursuant to Chapter 28F of the Code of Iowa. The Commission's fulfillment of its payment obligations to Ringgold County under the Revenue Agreement is hereby approved. The Board approves the execution and delivery of such other necessary and related documents by the Board and the Commission necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution, including, without limitation any certification of the County as a Benefited Governmental Entity for purpose of Section 265(b)(3)(c)(iii) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, (the "Code") and any necessary allocation of the General Obligation Bonds to the County for purposes of Section 265(b)(3) of the Code.

Section 4. All resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Moore made a motion to pass and approve Resolution 25-19, seconded by Lange.

Wilson attended the 1015 Transit meeting and reported that veteran ridership is about the same as last month and it was estimated that \$22,000 was spent in the last quarter for Wayne County's Veterans.

Lange attended the Council of Government (COG) meeting and reported that the Governor is redirecting some of the funding away from local programs.

No Discussion items

Public Comments: Don Seams asked why the county needs to request a filing extension. Auditor Dooley responded that this is at the request of the State Auditor's Office. Seams also wanted to know how the general obligation bond for the Wayne, Ringgold & Decatur County Landfill will be paid. Supervisor Moore responded that the bond would be paid for by annual member allocation and dump fees.
