Wayne County Board of Supervisors

A regular meeting of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors was held on the 18th day of March 2025, at the Wayne County Courthouse in the Lower-Level Conference Room, Corydon, Iowa, pursuant to notice duly given in compliance with the Iowa Code Section 21.4. The Board noted due notice of meeting subject to said Code Section.

Present- Chris Moore, Todd Wilson, and Lance Lange members of the Board. Also in attendance: Dillon Davenport, Dan Carpenter, Braxton Johnston, Don Seams, Savanah Sandy, and Michelle Dooley.

The Corydon Times Republican live streams the Board of Supervisors regular session meetings on their Facebook page. Unless otherwise noted, all motions are approved unanimously by all Board members present.

Moore called the meeting to order at 10:00AM and took roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance

Wilson made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve March 4, 2025, Regular Meeting Minutes, seconded by Wilson.

Lange made a motion to approve March 14, 2025, payroll, seconded by Wilson.

Wilson made a motion to approve March 18, 2025, claim set, seconded by Lange.

No public comments on agenda items.

Lange made a motion to accept and approve the winning bids for the two (2) Chevy Tahoe vehicles, seconded by Wilson. DeWayne James \$12,500 for Tahoe (A).

Brian Brittain \$7,511 for Tahoe (B).

Bids made by Ringwood Motors Inc for A & B were not accepted because they did not meet or exceed the reserve.

Engineer Dillon Davenport reported that the Jubilee bridge is complete and open to traffic. The concrete crushing on Liberty Road (east) is complete and road rock will be applied soon. Both tree grinders are working throughout the county.

Lange made a motion to approve the capital asset addition for the ESI county wide PBX phone system, seconded by Wilson. The ESI phone system was purchased from South Central Communication/Grand River Mutual Networks and valued at \$12,918.49. Useful life is set for five (5) years.

Monthly Department Reports:

Wilson made a motion to approve the Recorder's February Report, seconded by Lange. Deposits were \$4,446.43. Wilson made a motion to approve the Clerk of Court's February Report, seconded by Lange. Deposits were \$627.60. Lange made a motion to approve the Sheriff's February Report, seconded by Wilson. Deposits were \$23,074.56.

Supervisor's meetings update:

Lange attended the Wayne County Conservation Board meeting. Parks should be open April 1st. Conservation staff have burnt off part of the prairie grass but now there is a burn ban on for Wayne County so burning as seized until the ban is lifted.

Wilson attended the Safety Action Plan workshop coordinated by Engineer Davenport. Wilson will be attending a peer's meeting for OPIOID settlement as well as DECAT and Milestone meeting later in the week.

Moore attended the Public Health Board meeting. Public Health nursing is doing well collecting payments for services. The staff is working hard on cross training.

Moore also spoke about the Wayne, Ringgold and Decatur (WRD) County Landfill. Members are reviewing and approving documents for bonding. The Board is moving through the steps to build two new cells (5 & 6). Their schedule is as follows; April accept bids, May review bids and June award winning bid.

Moore also attended the Heart of Iowa Mental Health Region meeting and they are developing a transition plan for the state. The region has 16 employees, the state is requesting personnel to remain after June 30th without a guarantee of compensation because funding is projected to end on June 30th. Moore expects lot of services and expenses to fall back on the county to be liable for. Mendy Middlebrook is employed by the county and reimbursed by the region. Her position is not being eliminated locally but it may change in duties.

Discussion:

Joella Perry, Wayne County Veteran Service Officer, was present and wanted to make sure that the public is aware that her position is not being eliminated by the cuts made by the Federal or State Government. All funding for her position is funded by local funds except for training dollars that are reimbursed by the State Government. All counties are required by the Code Section to have a County Veteran Service Officer.

County Auditor Dooley also spoke about the recent mailing from the Auditor's Office. The main purpose of this mailing is to try to inform all Wayne County property owners of the 1st public budget hearing meeting for the County, School Districts and Cities and what the maximum proposed property tax levy is for each of the taxing authorities.

Public Comments: Don Seams asked if there is any progress made for wind turbine/solar farm ordinance. Moore stated that the Washington County Ordinance only pertained to wind turbines and was more restrictive than he had hoped for. Seams is going to review his documents to see if his samples included solar farms and forward it to the Board for further review.
