Wayne County Board of Supervisors

A regular meeting of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors was held on the 27th day of May 2025, at the Wayne County Courthouse in the Lower-Level Conference Room, Corydon, Iowa, pursuant to notice duly given in compliance with the Iowa Code Section 21.4. The Board noted due notice of meeting subject to said Code Section.

Present- Chris Moore, Todd Wilson (By Phone), and Lance Lange members of the Board. Also in attendance: Dillon Davenport, Dan Carpenter, Becky Maxwell, Teresa Evans, Kellie Anderson, Don Seams, and Michelle Dooley.

The Corydon Times Republican & Humeston New Era recorded the Board of Supervisors regular session meeting and will post on their Facebook page.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions are approved unanimously by all Board members present.

Moore called the meeting to order at 10:02AM and took roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance

Moore made a motion to approve the agenda with two additional action items: 1) Mormon Trail Community Services Corp Request for \$1,000 financial support for swim lessons and 2) Settlement Agreement between lowa Economic Development Authority, East Penn Manufacturing Co. and Wayne County, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve May 13, 2025, Regular Meeting Minutes, seconded by Moore.

Lange made a motion to approve May 23, 2025, payroll, seconded by Wilson.

Lange made a motion to approve May 27, 2025, claim set, seconded by Wilson.

No public comments on agenda items.

Engineer Dillon Davenport reported the following:

Manatts Inc will be completing some corrective work on surface imperfections on J45 west of Seymour on May 29 & 30.

Gryp Construction replaced and repaired the guardrail on S56(N of Promise City) & J20 (SW of Humeston).

Motorgrader training is scheduled for the week of June 1st.

Chad Krul was hired for the roadside manager position. He is scheduled to start June 16th.

Lange made a motion to approve the lowa DOT Federal-aid Agreement for project# STP-S-C093 (98)—5E-93, seconded by Wilson.

Lange made a motion to approve the Capital Asset Addition for a 64HD Maurer supply power washer, seconded by Wilson. The washer was purchased from Maurer Supply for \$8,500. Useful life expectancy is 7 years.

Lange made a motion to approve an \$1,000 allocation for swimming lessons at the Mormon Trail swimming pool requested by the Mormon Trail Community Services Corp, seconded by Moore as long as no child is turned away from participating in swimming lessons due to financial reasons.

Moore made a motion to table the City of Corydon's request for the county allocation of \$2,000 designated for swimming lessons be changed to support other future projects at the Prairie Trails Aquatic Center. Motion died for lack of a second.

Lange made a motion to approve the settlement agreement between Iowa Economic Development Authority, East Penn Manufacturing Co. and Wayne County, seconded by Wilson.

Monthly Department Reports:

Wayne County Development Director, Kellie Anderson reminded everyone that the First Thursday Coffee is scheduled for June 5th at 7:30AM at the Development Office.

Lange made a motion to approve the Sheriff's April report, seconded by Moore. Deposits totaled \$27,045.71. Dooley reported that as of April 30th, 2025, the county was holding \$12,496,300.97.

Supervisor's meetings update:

Lange attended the COGs (Iowa Councils of Governments) meeting at the Chariton Valley Planning & Development Office. Lange reported that the Governor has reinstated some funding back into the program.

Moore attended the Wayne, Ringgold, Decatur (WRD) County Landfill meeting. The winning bid was awarded for constructing cell 5 & 6. It is \$1.485 million project and work should begin around July 1st. WRD Landfill Commissioners will meet on Wednesday, May 28th to approve the budget.

Moore attended the Heart of Iowa Mental Health Region meeting. He reported that the expenditure was overstated because of a miscalculation and that the region is sitting at \$40,000 balance. This should cover the remaining cost incurred by the region. No audit report should be required for FY26. Iowa Primary Care will be taking over the mental health services effective July 1st and hopefully they will be hiring employees/contractors from the current pool of individuals who are working directly with clients now at the county level as Care Coordinators.

Moore also reported that the Public Health Nursing Department is doing very well in this transition year of combining Homemaker Services with Public Health Nursing. Moore anticipates another great year for the Public Health Nursing Department moving forward into FY26 and hopes the FY27 Budget can be more accurate with actual revenues and expenditures. Wilson attended the DECAT meeting. Currently, they have approximately one year of funding left for their programs. Wilson also attended the 10-15 Transit meeting, but much has changed since the last meeting.

Discussion: David Rhodes, Environmental Health Director, reported that the railroad has reached out to the DNR requesting the specific location of the railroad ties in Sewal.

Public Comments: Don Seams asked if the settlement agreement with the Iowa Economic Development Authority, East Penn Manufacturing Company and Wayne County effects the property tax abatement that was given to East Penn for the expansion by the county. Moore responded that it does not.
