

## Wayne County Board of Supervisors

A regular meeting of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors was held on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 2026, at the Wayne County Courthouse in the Lower-Level Conference Room, Corydon, Iowa, pursuant to notice duly given in compliance with the Iowa Code Section 21.4. The Board noted due notice of meeting subject to said Code Section.

Present- Chris Moore, Todd Wilson, and Lance Lange members of the Board. Also in attendance: Dillon Davenport, Don Seams, Chase Clark, Becky Maxwell, and Michelle Dooley.

**Unless otherwise noted, all motions are approved unanimously by all Board members present.**

Moore called the meeting to order at 10:00AM and took roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance

Wilson made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve March 31, 2026, FY27 Budget Additional Public Hearing minutes, seconded by Wilson.

Wilson made a motion to approve April 14, 2026, Regular Meeting minutes, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve April 21, 2026, 2<sup>nd</sup> Tier Canvass minutes for Mormon Trail CSD Special Election held April 7, 2026, seconded by Wilson.

Wilson made a motion to approve April 24, 2026, payroll, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve April 28, 2026, claim, seconded by Wilson.

No public comments on agenda items.

Engineer Dillon Davenport reported the following:

Engineer's Office & Secondary Roads Department has started working summer hours on April 20<sup>th</sup>.

Monday through Thursday 6AM-4:30PM

Culvert crew will continue to grind trees/brush until more favorable weather conditions.

CR Environmental has been contracted for ROW spraying.. They should begin late summer and will work in Clinton, Grand River, Jefferson, and Clay townships.

Both excavators/brush grinders are working around Millerton/North of Corydon.

The mantis is working around guard rails near Promise City.

No change with the S60 overlay project. It is still scheduled to begin at the end of June or first of July.

Havard bridge is entering into a phase II archeological survey on the south end only. No date is scheduled except for "early" summer. The public should be aware the team is made up of 4 individuals, and they will be digging 7 or 8 – 1-meter square holes.

Lange made a motion to approve \$5,000 allocation from OPIOID Funds for the South-Central Iowa Community Action Program (SCICAP) for bed construction for children, seconded by Wilson. Auditor Dooley is directed to cut the payment today rather than waiting until the next claim set.

Moore introduced Resolution 26-26 **Local Effort for Secondary Road Fund**

**Whereas:** The Auditor is authorized to periodically order transfers from the General Basic Fund and Rural Service Basic Fund to the Secondary Road fund during the 2026-2027 budget year in accordance with Iowa Code § 331.432(1)a & b as follows.

**Section 1.** The total maximum transfer from the General Basic Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, shall not exceed \$85,819.

**Section 2.** The total maximum transfer from the Rural Service Basic Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2026, shall not exceed \$1,037,618.

**Section 3.** The total maximum transfer for local effort to Secondary Roads is \$1,123,437 for FY27.

**Section 4.** Within ten (10) days of being notified of the apportionment of current property taxes, state replacements against the levied property taxes, mobile home taxes, military replacements against the General Basic and Rural Service Basic Fund, the Auditor shall order a transfer from said funds to Secondary Road Fund to the Treasurer.

**Section 5.** Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 1 & 2 the amount of any transfer shall not exceed available fund balances in the transferring fund.

Lange made a motion to approve Resolution 26-26, seconded by Wilson.

Lange made a motion to set FY26 Budget Amendment Public Hearing on Tuesday, May 12, 2026, in the Wayne County Courthouse, Lower-level Conference Room at 10AM, second by Wilson.

Lange made a motion to approve & set hazard mitigation meeting with Chariton Valley Planning & Development following the Board of Supervisor 1st regular meeting in May, June & July, seconded by Wilson.

The board discussed options for employees to opt out of participating in County offered Health Insurance Benefit. Moore stated that the State of Iowa offers \$125 per month to employees who opt out of the health insurance benefit. More research needs to be done on the different options, and this item will be on the next meeting agenda.

**Discussion:** Moore stated that Mendy Middlebrook’s weekly hours need to be reviewed for New Venture Home and there may need to be an adjustment before the new fiscal year starts on July 1, 2026.

Clark, IT Director/911 Coordinator, reported that the contract for the communication tower has been signed and we should be receiving our 1<sup>st</sup> invoice for the project. Clark also reported that the new access system should be installed and fully operational today. He will be working with Auditor Dooley and Courthouse Maintenance, Aaron Hoelting to implement the changeover from physical keys to badge.

There was also discussion about getting the Sheriff’s Office generator and getting electric service from the Sheriff’s Office to the Public Health Building for the Emergency Management Response Center. Dooley also asked about a tornado siren on the new water tower near Sewal and who would be the point of contact for a siren to be installed. She was referred to EMA Coordinator, Susan Moore.

**Supervisor’s meetings update**

Wilson attended 1015 Transit meeting as well as Southern Iowa Response Group (SIRG) meeting. The Ottumwa Fire chief was very impressed by the response of the local fire departments who responded to the fire at Stubbs Petroleum plant on March 7<sup>th</sup>. Wilson has also visited the site for the new communication tower with 911 Coordinator, Chase Clark and discussed the need for some fences needing to be cleaned up around the site. Lange will visit with Chris Brown, the current lease holder of the county farm, about doing the cleaning up the fence row and deducting a portion from the annual lease payment.

Moore had no scheduled meetings to report on.

Lange attended the South-Central Iowa Community Action Program (SCICAP) meeting. They are looking for a few more students for the Head Start Program other wise the Federal funding application will need to be adjusted.
