Nickel made the second. Motion carried. All ayes. Additional fans will be purchased and installed for all shower houses if they work properly to reduce moisture.

- C. All vehicles, mowers, tractor, and skidder have been winterized
- D. Discuss getting stump grinder
  - a. Kenny recommends \$5,500 Jenkins: Banks reported the stump grinder fits on the skid loader and will be a very useful addition to the park. With no gravely mower up for replacement this year, Schroeder made the motion to buy the stump grinder. Nickel made the second. Motion carried. All ayes.
- E. Winterfest Continuing Education is January 23-25: Banks gave insight information to board members on the speakers and classes available to attend for all three staff

- members. Schroeder made the motion for Banks, Arnold and Snow to attend the Winterfest Continuing Education Conference in January 2024.
