# Wayne County Board of Supervisors

Regular scheduled meeting of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors was held on the 17th day of May 2021, in the Conference Room of the Wayne County Courthouse, Corydon, Iowa, pursuant to notice duly given in compliance with Iowa Code Section 21.4. The Board noted due notice of meeting subject to said Code Section.

Present were David Dotts, Tom Swearingin, Don Seams: members of the Board, Roger Shindell, Stephanie Lathrop, Bill Byrns, Randy Zerr, Jen Reed, Rhonda Bennett, and Michelle Dooley.

The Corydon Times Republican live streams Board of Supervisors regular session meetings on their facebook page.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions are approved unanimously by all Board members present.

Dotts called meeting to order at 9:00AM and took roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance

TSwearingin made motion to approve the May 17, 2021 agenda, seconded by Seams.

Seams made motion to approve May 3, 2021 minutes, seconded by TSwearingin.

TSwearingin made motion to approve May 14, 2021 payroll, seconded by Seams.

Seams made motion to approve May 17, 2021 claims, seconded by TSwearingin.

Roger Shindell, Carosh Compliance Solutions, LLC along with Stephanie Lathrop was present to discuss the County's HIPPA Program and the renewal for their services. TSwearingin made the motion to approve the renewal for FY22 for \$9,825.00, seconded by Seams.

Bill Byrns, EMA & 911 Director gave the Board an update regarding funding for the Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. Nichole Moore, Chariton Valley Planning & Development is submitting the Notice of Intent.

Randy Zerr, County Engineer discussed the Medicine Creek Project. The Department of Natural Resources has approved the Flood Plain design. Currently, November 16, 2021 is the scheduling letting date. Zerr is also working with Stacy Gibbs & the City of Corydon on the 28E Agreement. Conservation Department will be working to identify the different trees in the courtyard after Memorial Day. Secondary Roads will be working on 3 culverts on S40; North of Davis Road.

TSwearingin made motion to approve the Wayne County Secondary Roads Department Drug & Alcohol Testing Policy & Handbook, seconded by Seams.

Joella Perry, Veteran Affair Administrator presented LuAnn Argetsinger's resignation letter as VA Commissioner. Seams made the motion to accept Argetsinger's resignation, seconded by TSwearingin. Perry requested the Supervisors to approve the new commissioner appointment of Jack Green. TSwearingin made motion to appoint Jacqueline Green as Veteran Affair Commissioner effective immediately, seconded by Seams.

Perry also requested the Supervisors to approve hiring LuAnn Argetsinger as contract labor until a part time position can be advertised and hired in FY22 at a \$15 per hour rate. Seams made motion to hire LuAnn Argetsinger as contract labor, seconded by TSwearingin.

#### **RESOLUTION NUMBER #21-30**

#### A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WAYNE COUNTY APPROVING MENTAL HEALTH MONTH 2021

WHEREAS, mental health is essential to everyone's overall health and well-being; and

WHEREAS, Mental Health America reports that 9.7% of youth have severe major depression. This rate was highest among youth who identify as more than one race, at 12.4%. Even before COVID-19, the prevalence of mental health illness among adults was increasing, an increase of 1.5 million people over last year's data. In addition, Mental Health America, from January 2020 to September 2020, there was a reported 93% increase in anxiety screenings and 62% increase in depression screenings; and

WHEREAS, education is an effective way to reduce the stigma of mental health illnesses; and WHEREAS, mental health illnesses are real and prevalent in our county regardless of socioeconomic boundaries; and

**WHEREAS**, we encourage our citizens to get help for mental health illnesses and to understand it is as important to treat as any other illness, such as diabetes or heart disease; and

WHEREAS, each business, school, government agency, healthcare provider, organization and citizen shares the burden of mental health illnesses and has a responsibility to promote mental wellness and support prevention efforts; and

**WHEREAS**, through increased awareness, we can achieve our goal to abandon negative stigmatism and reinforce our acceptance of individuals seeking treatment; then

THEREFORE, I <u>David Dotts</u>, Chair Wayne County Board of Supervisors, do hereby proclaim May 2021 as Mental Health Month in County, Iowa. As the Chair, I also call upon the citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses and schools of Wayne County, Iowa to recommit our community to increasing awareness and understanding of mental health, the steps our citizens can take to protect their mental health, and the need for appropriate and accessible services for all people with mental illnesses at all stages.

TSwearingin made motion to authorize Resolution 21-30, seconded by Seams.

Dooley presented a quote from Scantron Technology for a Replibit Backup & Office 365 Backup because the current Axcient Backup is being faced out. TSwearingin made motion to approve the quote for the Replibit Backup & O365 Backup, seconded by Seams.

Cooper and Dooley attended a zoom kick off meeting with Chrissy Castello with Tyler Technology. January 1, 2022 is the target completion date for the project.

Seams discussed the need for Tuckpointing to be completed on the Northeast corner of the Courthouse. Eli Yoder submitted a bid of \$6,000. TSwearingin made motion to accept and approve the bid from Eli Yoder, seconded by Seams. Seams will communicate with Yoder to determine a start date.

The County Recorder's April Report was presented. Deposits were \$6,341.45. Seams made motion to accept the Recorder's April Report, seconded by TSwearingin.

The Clerk of Court's April Report was presented. Deposits were \$1,290.69. TSwearingin made motion to accept the Clerk of Court's April Report, seconded by Seams.

The County Sheriff's April Report was presented. Deposits were \$34,017.21. Seams made motion to accept the Sheriff's April Report, seconded by TSwearingin.

The County Treasurer's Cash & Outstanding March Report was presented. TSwearingin made motion to accept the Treasurer's March Report, seconded by Seams.

Discussion: Chris Furlin has completed the courtyard project and has done a good job filling in the holes. Seams requesting Aaron Hoelting, Building & Ground Maintenance to look into painting the courthouse.

TSwearingin attended Conservation Board meeting. Camping season is in full swing.

Dotts attended Wayne, Ringgold & Decatur County Landfill meeting and the Department Head/Elected Official meeting.

Seams attended an in-person Iowa Workforce Development Board meeting. They approved the South-Central Iowa Workforce Area local budget and are meeting the state deadline.

Joella Perry, Veteran Affair Administrator also wanted to make sure everyone is aware of the Outreach Dinner being held on June 10, 2021 in Allerton. Meet and Greet starts at 4PM and dinner will be served at 6PM. Marty Nichols is catering. A letter has also been mailed out to Veterans explaining some new programs available. Perry is also working on a Veteran Project Honor Wall with the Humeston Livestock Exchange. Perry is also working with the Township Trustees & Clerks to make sure flag holders and flags are on the grave sights of all veterans. Perry also wanted everyone to know that the Veteran Affair Administration Program is being revamped in the coming months. David Dotts wanted to remind everyone that volunteers are needed for putting flags up for Memorial Day at the Seymour South Lawn Cemetery on May 26<sup>th</sup> at 4PM and May 28<sup>th</sup> at 4PM. Volunteers are also needed for the Shriver Cemetery west of Seymour.

Public Comment: The Public Notice for the Special Election held on April 27, 2021 to fill a council seat vacancy for the City of Corydon was published twice for their eligible electors and the election cost \$2,100.
