Regular County Conservation Board meetings held in accordance with Iowa Code 350.3.

There were 12 regular meetings during the fiscal year.

Lance Lange was appointed to the Conservation Board as a supervisor in January 2024 to finish out fiscal year for Don Seams.

Mike Lewis resigned from the board on May 20, 2024.

Ashleigh Arnold turned in her resignation on June 28, 2024.

Conservation Park enhancements:

- Cut several dead Ash Trees (ash bore) at Corydon Lake Park
 - o Continuing cutting of Ash Trees in all parks
- Helga, IDNR, helped implement a bow only management hunt at Bobwhite State Park
- Cut 200 trees from Corydon Lake Park
 - o Burned all the tops below the lake dam
 - o Marked more trees for removal at Corydon Lake Park
- Raised camping prices to \$20 a night
- Installed a new sewer line at Bobwhite in July of 2023
- Leveling camp pads and extending them at Bobwhite
- IDNR restock of Humeston Lake
- IDNR restock of Medicine Creek Wildlife Area Lake
- Had new park signs hung on Highway 2 by DOT for Lakeside Park
